We want our streets to have **more safe space** for everyone to walk and cycle, for children to get to and from school **safely and healthily**, for you to be **breathing cleaner air**, to **reduce carbon emissions** from vehicles and for businesses to **flourish**.

We want to ensure that our streets provide a lasting legacy of **greener, safer and healthier travel**.



Healthy School Street Consultation St George the Martyr C of E Primary School

St George the Martyr C of E Primary School sits in our Holborn Liveable Neighbourhood project area. We're proposing changes on local streets here as a "STARter" project - improvements that can be delivered in the shorter term. We want to make it safer and healthier for children to walk, cycle or scoot to school, so are proposing a trial Healthy School Street (timed motor vehicle restrictions on the streets around the school), alongside other permanent improvements. Our proposals include:

- A trial Healthy School Street with timed motor vehicle restrictions on Millman Street, Rugby Street and Great Ormond Street (east of Lamb's Conduit Street), between 8:30am to 9:30am and 3pm to 4pm, Mondays to Fridays during school term time only.
- Permanently installing six new bike hangars across the area to provide secure cycle storage and installing two way cycling in the area to improve cycle connectivity.
- Permanently making John's Mews one way southbound to reduce through traffic while keeping it two-way for cyclists to improve cycle connectivity in the area.
- Permanently adding double yellow lines at junctions across the area to improve visibility for drivers and people crossing the road.
- Permanently installing continuous pavement and two way cycling on Great James Street.

Exemptions for the Healthy School Street restrictions would be available for vehicles registered to properties and businesses located on the streets in the Healthy School Street area as well as Blue Badge holders that require access. All exemptions would need to be applied for. Emergency service, waste vehicles and other statutory services would be automatically exempt. Visit camden.gov.uk/healthy-school-streets for more details on exemptions.

The decision on whether to go ahead with the trial scheme will be made based on the evidence including the consultation responses, relevant policies, officer observations, and other data/information including monitoring information collected to date. If the trial goes ahead a decision on whether to make the trial changes permanent, amend or remove them would be made before the trial ended.
