We are delighted that St George the Martyr has made this link with Google and look forward to organising further visits in the future.

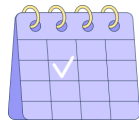

Thank you to all the parents and carers who came to this week's coffee morning about what to do if you think your child is being bullied or is involved with bullying.

Please find some of the key information that was shared during the Coffee Morning below.



You will see this poster displayed around school.

We explicitly teach the child that if something happens that makes them upset, they should look at this poster and check:

Is it rude?

Is it mean?

Or is it bullying?

It is important we use the correct words.

Be careful when using the word 'bullying'

- It only becomes bullying when the behaviour is intentionally hurtful and repeated over a period of time.

- Often bullying involves an imbalance of power

We tell children that all kinds of bullying are **NOT OK.**

Please remind your child:

- **There is nothing wrong with you if you are being bullied, it can happen to anyone.**
- **It's not your fault, but there are things you can do about it!**

• Physical, verbal, emotional, racist, homophobic, transgender or cyber abuse can all happen without it being 'bullying'.

• It is still not ok if unkind behaviour happens to your child.

• The school will still deal with all incidents of poor behaviour and want to meet with parents to hear about it.

• If parents throw around the word bullying unnecessarily, it can make the child feel like a victim and blow an incident out of proportion.

Remind your child that they must always tell an adult if they see or experience rude, mean or bullying behaviour.

What you should do if you believe your child is being bullied?

• Don't panic. It can happen to anyone.

• Your key role is to: listen, be calm and provide reassurance that the situation can get better when action is taken.

• Try and establish the facts.

• What happened? When? Where? Who else saw/heard? What did your child say/do?

• It can be helpful to write this down to share with the school.

• Meet and discuss the situation with your child's teacher. Frequently a senior leader will also be present at this meeting.
