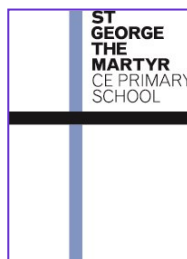

Please tell your friends and family to apply now as these last few places will go very quickly. Application forms are available from the school office and can be downloaded from our [website](#).

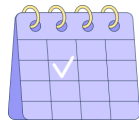
