School Uniform Policy

School uniform is compulsory at our school. All children must wear the school uniform, as agreed by parents in the Home-School Agreement when their child joins our school.

Wearing our school uniform helps children to feel a sense of identity and belonging to our school community.

Cost and availability

The school meets the statutory requirements of the Children's Wellbeing and Schools (Guidance about Costs of School Uniforms) Act 2026.

All of the uniform items listed below are required.

Compulsory branded school uniform items are available to buy from School Wear Inc. We have chosen School Wear Inc as our school uniform provider because the items are of good quality and are reasonably priced.

Some items of school uniform may be available second hand from the school office. Please pop in to the office to ask about second hand uniform.

School uniform which is available to buy through the School Wear Inc website:

- Red Sweatshirt with school logo OR Red Cardigan with school logo
- White PE T-shirt with school logo (Reception to Year Six)
- Red Rucksack with school logo



School uniform which is available from a range of High Street shops, e.g. John Lewis, Primark, Asda, M&S etc.

- Plain white short-sleeve polo shirt
- Year 1 to Year Six – Charcoal grey school trousers / school skirt/ school pinafore
- Nursery and Reception children - Charcoal grey jogging bottoms
- PE trousers (winter) Reception to Year Six - Charcoal grey jogging bottoms
- PE shorts (summer) Reception to Year Six - Red shorts
- Black Hijab (worn for religious reasons)
- White or grey socks / grey tights
- Plain black trainers or shoes suitable for learning and playing – No other colours present on the trainers are permitted.
- Summer uniform – red checked dresses / grey school shorts



All items of clothing should be named.

Make up and nail varnish

Make up and nail varnish are not permitted to be worn in school at any time. Children who arrive in school wearing make up and/or nail varnish will be asked to remove it.

Jewellery

Children are not allowed to wear jewellery such as rings, earrings or bracelets to school. If a child has pierced ears, a plain round stud may be worn but for health and safety reasons this will need to be removed by the pupil for PE and games.

Hair

For safety reasons, long hair should be tied back at all times.
